

## Driver Management Centres of HCCB making Indian roads safer!

As a beneficiary of the road infrastructure in the country, Hindustan Coca-Cola Beverages (HCCB) decided to play its role in trying to make Indian roads safer. Today, HCCB runs Driver Management Centres (DMCs) in 19 locations across its countrywide network of factories and depots.

The focus is on deploying the right vehicle hardware and inculcating safe driving practices in drivers. As such the DMCs use both training and technology, to monitor and control who is driving and what is being driven and applies to vehicles outsourced by the company to transport both its raw materials and finished goods. The work starts before the truck leaves the factory premises, remains active during the journey and continues even after the trip ends.

HCCB's DMCs have all the basic facilities such as beds, canteen and rest rooms. The idea is to ensure the drivers take proper rest and are in the right frame of mind before

they set out on their respective routes. Besides, there are experts at the HCCB DMCs, who analyse a host of other factors such as the time or the distance covered at a stretch, breaks and halts, health of the drivers, and their fitness. There are also alcohol checks done on every driver, every time they are to begin a drive. Drivers' mental condition is another factor that is examined before he gets behind the steering.

The technology enables the DMCs to track drivers' behaviours on road. The GPS installed in the trucks provide actionable insights on the behaviours the drivers demonstrate while driving. To its credit, HCCB has been able to install GPS in almost 25 per cent of the trucks in the fleet. The number will increase as the transporters add more dedicated trucks for HCCB.

## Driver Management Centres of HCCB making Indian roads safer!

Not leaving anything to chance, the company undertakes surprise 'mystery follow-ups' to ascertain whether the drivers are following the prescribed norms including the suggested routes or not. The data captured is used to rate and rank the drivers. Good behaviour is rewarded and awry behaviour is penalised by way of the company's ongoing reward and recognition programme titled Star Drivers Programme.

Continuous counselling and training constitute critical components of the DMCs. The drivers of dedicated vehicles are mandated to undergo class room trainings. In particular, the drivers are given Defensive Drivers Training, which among other things helps them be alert and be ready to expect the unexpected on roads.

The DMCs also maintain a dash board of key parameters of drivers' behaviours, training programmes and vehicle

monitoring reports and keep analysing the reported accidents. This helps the management take informed decisions to ensure the safety of all concerned.

Going forward, plans are afoot to digitise the entire operations of DMCs. On successful completion, the system will not only do away with manual recording of key observations pertaining to drivers' behaviours, their health reports, and key documents including maintenance records of the vehicles but will also help drivers monitor their own performance on mobile, helping them take corrective actions on real time.

HCCB remains committed to undertake whatever it takes to ensure safety of all.

## Lower Dibang Valley, Arunachal Pradesh

The district is situated in the eastern part of Arunachal Pradesh. It has a total area of 3900 sq kms. with a total population of 54080. The district is inhabited by Adi and Idu Mishmi tribes. Being centrally located amongst the eastern districts of the state, Lower Dibang valley is well connected with all weather roads to Lohit, Anjaw, Namsai, East Siang, Changlang and Dibang Valley districts of eastern Arunachal Pradesh.

Headquarter: Roing is the administrative headquarter of the district.

#### PLACES TO VISIT

**Bhishmak Nagar:** This mythological heritage site is situated 24 kms south east of HQ Roing. It is also the oldest archeological site in Arunachal Pradesh. The ruins of an ancient fort made up of burnt bricks dating back to the 12th century A.D still exists.

**Sally Lake:** Is a natural lake and forms a part of the Mehao wildlife sanctuary. The lake, surrounded by thick natural vegetation is apt for picnic and leisure.

**Mayudia:** This small spot amidst wilderness is 56 kms from Roing and stands at an altitude of 8000 feet. It has a panoramic view of the surrounding mountains and landscape. Snow capped mountains add serenity to its environment.

**Hunli:** Hunli is a small picturesque town situated 90 kms from Roing. The ascending drive from Roing to Hunli along the winding twelve neck point (Baro Gulai) road provides a sense of adventure.

**Mehao Wildlife Sanctuary:** The sanctuary starts 17 kms from Roing and is spread over an area of 281.5 sq kms. The sanctuary is popular for activities like birdwatching, wildlife photography, trekking etc. Popular findings in the sanctuary are flying squirrel, Hollock Gibbon, Mishmi Takin, Red Panda, spotted leopard etc.

**Mehaolake:** This is a vast lake covering an area of about 4 sq. kms. The lake forms a part of the Mehao wildlife sanctuary. Extremely rich in flora and fauna, this lake can be reached only by trekking.

**Dambuk:** The land of oranges and heritage, the place is the venue for the popular event Orange Festival of Adventure and Music (OFAM). The place also has the historical heritage site Bongal Yapgo, the place where the Adi's had defended the area from the British army during 1892-1893.

"Journalism is printing what somebody doesn't want printed," This quote, which sometimes is attributed to George Orwell, is one of the first lessons in IIMC journalism

courses. Few have put it to practice as well, as our Alumni of the Year, over the past 12 months.

He brought to light three official survey reports that were either put on backburner, buried till elections took place or scrapped completely. His big break on a hidden NSSO report that said the unemployment rate in the country had touched a 45-year-high in 2017-18 inspired his peers at a time the profession is facing ridicule and difficult times and made him a star journalist.

Global economists and academia took note of it and their strong reactions led the authorities to release the report. His work became a source of research studies on two key economic indicators in India: poverty and unemployment.

India Journalism Review, a portal run by a former editor of Outlook, called him "The millennial journalist who broke the story of the year". He also won the Seema Nazareth award for excellence in Print Journalism for 2019.

Despite the awards and adulations, he has kept at it bringing out more suppressed inconvenient news, data and reports as he covers the financial services space for Business Standard. The recent one being another withheld NSSO survey report showed consumer spending falling for the first time in 4 decades.

For keeping it simple, for punching much above his weight and for taking the IIMC flag to newer heights, Somesh is our Alumni of the Year.


#### RESEARCH PAPER IN MASS COMMUNICATION

His paper gives a perfect background on how technology has transformed the communication patterns in India by providing greater opportunity to the isolated and marginalised population to express, participate and connect to the networked society.









ying unassumingly in the plains of Jharkhand, is a historical and cultural marvel – ancient tribal megaliths spread over 53 known sites and hundreds of acres. Jharkhand has the highest occurrence of historical megaliths in India, the oldest of which date back to 1 A.D. These ancient wonders, which are comparable to the iconic Stonehenge megaliths in Britain, are largely unexplored.

Notable sites where megaliths have been discovered in abundance are the Chokahatu site of the Ranchi district, as well as the Chatra, Hazaribagh, Ramgarh, Lohardaga and Khunti districts. Chokahatu is the most astounding of all the sites - it has over 7000 megaliths and is spread over 7 acres! Since tribes in Jharkhand have been erecting these structures for various ceremonial and scientific purposes for thousands of years, the megaliths serve as timeless storytellers. Sasandiri, a type of megalith, is made of a large stone slab placed on four small stones, like a tabletop. Sasandiris were used as family grave vaults wherein members of the same family were buried, along with artifacts such as pottery and jewelry. Menhirs, on the other hand, were erected to commemorate significant events such as the birth of a child, or used by the

dominant tribe to codify the rules of the village.

Perhaps the most intriguing aspect of these prehistoric megaliths is their central role in ancient astronomy. The megaliths of Punkri Burwadih, Chano, Birbir and Katia Murwey are aligned to the sunrises and sunsets of the Equinoxes and the Summer and Winter Solstices. Today, Punkri Burwadih is the only site in India where throngs of people gather to witness stunning views of the sunrise during the Solstices, through the V-shaped configuration of the stones. It is truly a spellbinding vista, which is enhanced by a deep appreciation of the Neolithic tribes' precocious scientific expertise.

The megaliths of Jharkhand are hidden gems that need to be preserved and celebrated for all the value they add to our understanding of the past. They are worthy of being instated as UNESCO World Heritage Sites – after all, they are no less than the Stonehenge of India. While being recognized by UNESCO may be a long-term goal, what is easier achieved is bestowing upon these monuments the respectful appreciation that they deserve. So, when planning your next getaway, seek out the megaliths of Jharkhand and immerse yourself in the wonders of prehistoric arts and sciences.
