**Ashok Ogra** English Journalism, Delhi 1976-77 Batch

Ashok Ogra is a noted management and media professional and now an educator. He has over 45 years of experience of working at senior positions in Print, Radio, and Television media. He is now a full-time media educator.

In his current role, he works as an Advisor with Apeejay Education, New Delhi. Previously he has worked as Director of the Apeejay Institute of Mass Communication from 2003 till 2018.

Ashok started his career with 'The Tribune' in 1977 and later joined Doordarshan as Producer (News & Current Affairs). In 1987, he became the Director of Doordarshan.

He was a senior member of the start-up team that launched Discovery Channel in 1995 and Animal Planet in 1998 where he worked as Vice President (South Asia). Both Discovery & Animal Planet emerged as the most admired and preferred media networks in the region.

He has also taught at the Film & TV Institute, Pune and served as a Jury Member of various film festivals including the prestigious National Film Awards.

He has been on the 'Executive Council' of Jammu Central University; 'Board of Studies' of Jamia Millia Islamia (MCRC); University of Rajasthan; Management School of Jammu University and other State Government and private Universities.

He is closely associated with IIMC and is serving on the Board of Studies. He is also invited by leading institutes to interact with the students and the faculty. He writes a regular column for a leading English newspaper on varied subjects.

**Jahnabi Phookan** English Journalism, Delhi 1980-81 Batch

Jahnabi Phookan is an entrepreneur of over three decades, from Assam. She is the co-founder of two National Tourism Award-winning companies: Jungle Travels India (1989) and

Assam Bengal Navigation Company (2003) under JTI Group, Assam.

In 2007, as Founder Vice Chairperson of FICCI FLO's Northeast Chapter, she got involved in the handloom sector as it was a core activity of Assam's rural women. With human trafficking being an issue, Jahnabi facilitated training of trafficked women in handloom, ensuring their rehabilitation. She continued to work with rural weavers and in 2011, she formalised her Lahé Looms Weavers Centre, for migrant women. Over the years, Lahé (which means slow in Assamese) Looms has embodied slow fashion and the sustainable way of life for Assam's women weavers and supports artisans across the Northeast in her two stores in Assam's capital, Guwahati (www.lahelooms.com).

Jahnabi was the 37th national President of FICCI FLO (2020-21) with a Pan India membership of 8000 women and 18 chapters then. Her flagship programme of Village Adoption led to 143 villages Pan India adopted and which continued beyond her tenure.

She has been a member of the National Board of Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE) now under the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MosDE), since 2012.

Jahnabi's journey in IIMC was preceded by Calcutta University. She is an alumna of Indiana University, USA as well. She was conferred Doctorate of Letters (D. Litt) \_ Honoris Causa by Assam Downtown University in 2018, in recognition of "her contribution in eco-tourism and in efforts for women's causes". She is the Vice-President of IIMCAA, North East Chapter.

**Sujata Sabnis** English Journalism, Delhi 1982-83 Batch


Sujata Sabnis is a novelist and has written four novels till date. Her latest novel is a murder mystery "Blood on the sands". Her earlier novels are 'Silent whispers', 'A twist in destiny' and 'Songs of Stone'.

She is the principal writer for 'Sab Ka Sai' a web series on MX Player. She is also a co-organiser of the Pune chapter of Prabha Khaitan foundation, a national organisation that promotes literature.

She has written a screenplay titled 'Kutch' which has had the rare honour of being selected as the first Indian entry to the Berlinale Co- production market, part of the prestigious Berlin Film festival.

**Prof. Shambhu Nath Singh** Hindi Journalism, Delhi 1987-88 Batch

Prof. Shambhu Nath Singh has an illustrious career in journalism and academics. Currently he is the Vice Chancellor of the Tezpur Central University, one of the most respected universities in North East India.

After IIMC, Prof. Singh joined Pratipaksh Magazine as the Executive Editor. He then moved to Jansatta as the Assistant Editor and later joined Hindustan as an Associate Editor and went on to serve as the Political Editor before moving to Dainik Jagran group. Prof. Singh served as the media trainer for journalists of the Jagran group and was also a senior professor at the Jagran Institute of Management & Mass Communication.

Realising that academics had his heart, he joined IGNOU as a Professor and established the School of Journalism and New Media Studies, which became UNESCO Nodal Centre for Media Education of South Asia within three years. He was then appointed as the Vice Chancellor of Patna University. After completing his tenure in Patna, He returned to IGNOU as the Director of the school he established earlier.

He has been the chairman and the member of various search committees for the Vice Chancellors of universities, member of committees of UGC and the Censor Board. Prof. Singh attended the International Leadership Visitor Program in the United States of America in 2007. It is an exchange program of global repute and is conducted by the Department of state of USA. More than 300 alumni of this program have been head of states in respective countries.

**Dr. Medini Prasad Roy** Hindi Journalism, Delhi 1988-89 Batch

Dr. Medini Prasad Roy spent nine years at JNU to earn a Master's, an M.Phil. and a Ph.D. and learn how to speak and what to speak but with no job at hand. He spent nine months at IIMC, New Delhi to learn how to write and what to write that is politically

acceptable, socially desirable, technologically feasible, financially viable, administratively doable, legally tenable, emotionally relatable, and environmentally sustainable and landed with a job through UPSC in 1991.

Dr. Roy had to cover a long distance of skies to reach up to IIMC leaving behind a remote village in Bihar without electricity and a mother widowed long ago. He was at Science College, Patna when he lost his father. Describing an emotional moment, Dr. Roy says, "I was crying. My mother, who was formally unlettered but endowed with a deep insight into life, also started crying. She was sobbing and saying, "If Indira Gandhi, a widow, can run a country, I can let my son continue with his education". He goes on to say, Marshall McLuhan didn't know crying is a medium of communication in India.

Dr. Roy is well into the fifth year of his retirement and still working with the PM Unit of PIB as a Consultant. He is strategically keeping the greyness of his hair intact and says "I know wisdom doesn't come late in India, it is recognized late!" Mark Tully once said, "Bad news for a journalist is that you hardly get rich but good news is that you never retire." A journalist deals in knowledge. Knowledge grows with your age and so grows your business. But beware of ChatGPT and DeepSeek!

## Anshu Gupta Hindi Journalism, Delhi | 1990-91 Batch AD & PR, Delhi | 1991-92 Batch

Anshu Gupta has been chosen as the Alumni of the Year as Goonj, a pioneering organization that repositions urban surplus, as a tool for rural empowerment and development completed 25 years of its establishment in 2024.


Popularly known as the 'Clothing Man of India', Anshu is a social entrepreneur and recipient of the Ramon Magsaysay Award 2015. He left a corporate career in 1999 to establish Goonj.

Goonj is known as the first organization to work on 'clothing' as a development issue and for initiating widespread dialogues and grassroots solutions around development challenges such as menstrual health. The core philosophy of Goonj is rooted in dignity over charity while addressing critical issues such as water, sanitation, health, education, infrastructure, and disaster relief across India.

Goonj's innovations and impact have won many awards and accolades including the 'Game Changing Innovation' by NASA, World Bank's Global Development Market Place Award, 'Jamnalal Bajaj CFBP Award' for Fair Practices, Indian NGO of the Year Award, Changemakers Innovation Award, amongst many others.

Under Anshu's leadership, Goonj has become a global model of circular economy by transforming waste into resources for underserved communities, combating fast fashion's environmental impact. A Schwab and Ashoka Fellow, Anshu is a sought-after speaker globally. Forbes has recognized him as one of India's most influential rural entrepreneurs. He is also the founder of Gram Swabhimaan.

Anshu is a thought leader, innovator, a foodie, photographer, and journalist by heart. Anshu's and Goonj's work is also recognized in reputed publications like The New York Times. The story is covered by National Geographic apart from other reputed journals and media outlets. Harvard did a case study on Goonj.



## **ALUMNI OF THE YEAR**

**Neelesh Misra** English Journalism, Delhi 1994-95 Batch

Neelesh Misra, a storyteller, journalist, lyricist, and social entrepreneur, has been recognized as the Alumni of the Year. His interview series, The Slow Interview, features in-depth conversations

with thought leaders, artists, and changemakers, attracting a wide audience. Through this platform and The Slow Movement, he explores storytelling and mindful living, encouraging a more thoughtful and meaningful approach to life.

His career spans multiple creative fields. He is credited with reviving the lost art of oral storytelling in India through his iconic radio show 'Yaadon Ka Idiot Box', which has gained a cult following across generations and reached more than 100 million listeners. His ability to blend folklore, nostalgia, and social themes has made him one of the most influential storytellers of his time.

A prominent Hindi film lyricist, he has written for over 40 films, crafting songs that have left a lasting impact on Indian cinema. As a journalist, Neelesh has reported on some of the country's most pressing issues and has received India's highest journalism honours. He is also the author of five books, further cementing his legacy as a powerful voice in Indian literature.

Beyond storytelling, he is a changemaker and social entrepreneur. He founded Gaon Connection, India's largest rural media platform, which operates across 480 districts, bridging the information gap between urban and rural India.

Over the past two and a half decades, his contributions have been transformative. Through his words, music, journalism, and digital innovation, he continues to inspire and impact millions of lives.

## **Kishor Kaushal** Hindi Journalism, Delhi 2005-2006 Batch

Kishor Kaushal is a 2012 batch IPS officer of the Jharkhand cadre which happens to be his home state too. He is currently posted as Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) in Jamshedpur.

He is a highly disciplined and dedicated IPS officer. His leadership and commitment to public service have been instrumental in strengthening law enforcement and ensuring the safety of citizens in the regions he has served. Kishor has developed a deep understanding about the state of affairs and has dealt with several law and order situations efficiently. Throughout his career, he has been recognized for his dedication to the public service and his efforts to enhance policing standards in Jharkhand.

**आदित्य वर्धन** हिन्दी पत्रकारिता, दिल्ली 2014-15 बैच

बोधगया के रहने वाले आदित्य वर्धन जातक फाउंडेशन के संस्थापक निदेशक है। वर्ष 2021 में कुछ साथियों के साथ मिलकर आदित्य ने जातक फाउंडेशन की नीव रखी। इस संस्था का उद्देश्य शिक्षा, स्वास्थ्य, और डिजिटल मीडिया एवं सोशल

मीडिया के प्रभाव को ध्यान में रखते हुए डिजिटल साक्षरता का प्रचार करना है। ताकि इसके गलत उपयोग एवं दुष्प्रभाव से बचने के लिए लोगों को जागरूक किया जा सके। संस्था पर्यावरण संरक्षण के प्रति जागरूकता बढ़ाने के लिए ग्रामीण समुदायों के सहयोग से पौधारोपण कार्यक्रम आयोजित करती है। जातक फाउंडेशन के माध्यम से अब तक दस हजार से अधिक पौधे रोपे जा चुके हैं। संस्था स्कूली बच्चों को भी पर्यावरण संरक्षण की सीख देने के मकसद से विद्यालयों में विशेष पौधारोपण अभियान भी आयोजित करती है।

जातक फाउंडेशन का एक महत्वपूर्ण उद्देश्य वंचित समुदारों विशेषकर बिरहोर जनजाति के जीवन स्तर में सुधार लागा है। बिरहोर जनजाति को भारत सरकार ने विशेष रूप से कमजोर जनजातीय समूह (PVTG) के रूप में वर्गीकृत किया है। जातक फाउंडेशन बिरहोर समाज के बीच बच्चों की बुनियादी शिक्षा और बेहतर स्वास्थ्य सुविधाओं के लिए काम कर रहा है। संस्था के प्रयासों से बिरहोर समुदाय में स्वास्थ्य जागरूकता बढ़ी है और अब ये लोग स्वास्थ्य शिविरों में सिक्रय रूप से भाग लेते है। संस्था इस दिशा में भी काम कर रही है कि सरकारी योजनाओं का लाभ बिरहोर जनजाति तक पहुंचे और उनके जीवन में बदलाव आए।

आदित्य ने गया में शुरुआती शिक्षा के बाद दिल्ली स्थित जवाहरलाल नेहरू विश्वविद्यालय से स्नातक, भारतीय जनसंचार संस्थान से पीजी डिप्लोमा और दक्षिण बिहार केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय, गया से मीडिया एवं जनसंचार में पीएवडी किया है। करियर की शुरुआत में आदित्य ने प्रिंट मीडिया में काम किया। जातक फाउंडेशन के जरिए आदित्य शिक्षा, जागरूकता और सामुदायिक विकास के काम में जुटे हैं। उनका मानना है कि शिक्षा और सामुहिक प्रयासों से न्यायपूर्ण और उज्जवल समाज का निर्माण किया जा सकता है।

What began with just a handful of members has now blossomed into a thriving community of over 350 IIMCians worldwide. Among them is Braj Khandelwal, 83, one of the most senior and active voices in the group.

Over time, 'News' has evolved beyond sharing current events—it has become a vital support network. Whether it's sharing job leads, professional contacts, or recommendations for books that hold as much value as newspapers, the group meets a wide range of needs. Members often reach out for academic resources, career advice, and even humanitarian assistance, all of which are addressed with a spirit of camaraderie.

Even after more than four years at the helm, Ketan says he still experiences a thrill every time he helps a fellow IIMCian, confident that each small act of support makes a significant difference.

Currently serving as the News Editor of The Free Press Journal in Mumbai, Ketan Tanna is a seasoned journalist and editor with over 30 years of experience in both Indian and international media. 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


